## Beware of Scam in Swabbing Cheeks of Seniors for DNA Cancer Checks

**Lincoln, NE (March 27, 2019)** – The Nebraska Department of Insurance and the Senior Health Insurance Information Program (SHIIP) have received multiple reports of groups going to senior living communities, assisted living facilities and senior centers offering to swab the cheeks of seniors for genetic material purportedly for DNA checks for cancer.

If a non-cancer patient is brought in for genetic testing under the pretense that it would be covered by Medicare, this may be a scam and should be avoided.

Be alert if the entity asking to swab you cannot comply with CMS requirements, especially if they request that you agree to be billed for services in the event Medicare does not pay for the service.

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) have set forth guidelines as to when Medicare will allow and pay for these services. CMS has determined that Next Generation Sequencing (NGS) as a diagnostic laboratory test, when performed in an approved and certified laboratory and when ordered by a treating physician, is allowed when **all** CMS requirements have been met.
